

LGRIP Planning Timeline

- Baldwin County continues to develop policies and procedures and program materials
- The LGRIP Capacity Building sessions are informing the development of the project application
- The LGRIP project application is expected to launch in January 2025



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- Setting up application in phases
 - Project eligibility
 - Evaluation of project scope and outcomes
 - Post-award requirements for project set up
- Phased submissions will provide capacity for meeting application requirements



LGRIP CAPACITY BUILDING SESSION

Phase 1: Does this project meet the minimum requirements for eligibility?

- Project activity: Is the project type and its activities eligible for CDBG-DR?
 - Provide a narrative/scope for the project
 - Project Outcomes
- **Tie back to Storm:** Was the issue or need created by impacts from Hurricanes Sally and/or Zeta?
 - Provide documentation to show the storm impacts (pictures, news articles, topography study, etc)
- **Estimated project budget:** What is the estimated total project cost? What is the CDBG-DR request? What other funding sources are committed/expected?

LGRIP CAPACITY BUILDING SESSION

Phase 2: Evaluation of project details and requirements

Eligible projects provide complete details and show compliance with CDBG-DR and LRP requirements.

- Project location
- Population served
- Community services/critical infrastructure (if applicable)
- Mitigation
- National Objective
- Project timeline/schedule
- Detailed budget and CDBG-DR funding request
- Organizational capacity and project team

County Commission will evaluate the project and determine whether the project will receive an award and the amount of the award.

LGRIP CAPACITY BUILDING SESSION

Post-Award: Project set up needs

Project start will be dependent on final project designs and CDBG-DR compliance.

- Environmental Review
- Project plans and specifications
- Detailed cost estimate
- Community outreach (as needed)
- CDBG-DR Compliance trainings



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Category	Considerations	Scoring Criteria
		Top Score: Proposed project clearly addresses sewer/drainage improvement or construction and/or roadway repairs.
Project Activities	Are proposed project activities eligible project types?	Mid Score: Proposed project includes an eligible activity such as sewer or drainage improvement, or construction or roadway repairs.
		Low Score: Proposed project does not clearly include eligible project types.



Category	Considerations	Scoring Criteria
Mitigation Activities	What is the extent to which the proposed	Top Score: Proposed project clearly addresses sewer/drainage improvement or construction and/or roadway repairs.
	activity will be sustainable and maintainable over 5 years? How are mitigation measures and strategies incorporated into the project?	Mid Score: Application presents an operations and maintenance plan and mitigation measures that are not clearly defined; Or, application has either a clearly defined operations and maintenance plan or incorporates mitigation measures, but does not do both.
		Low Score: Application does not present a realistic operations and maintenance plan and the proposed activities do not appear to incorporate mitigation measures.



Category	Considerations	Scoring Criteria	
Population Served	Does the project provide	Top Score: Application clearly demonstrates how the proposed project will improve outcomes for populations that experienced the greatest storm impacts.	
	improved outcomes for populations and communities that saw a greater impact from the storms than others?	Mid Score: Application claims that the proposed project will improve outcomes for populations that experienced the greatest storm impacts, but does not offer sufficient support.	
		Low Score: Proposed project will not improve outcomes for populations that experienced the greatest storm impacts.	



Category	Considerations	Scoring Criteria
	The LRP identifies MID Recovery Zones as areas where vulnerable populations reside and local unmet needs exist. Does the project serve a MID Recovery Zone?	Top Score: Proposed project clearly serves a MID recovery zone.
MID Recovery Area Served		Mid Score: Proposed project claims to serve a MID Recovery Zone, but does not provide sufficient evidence.
		Low Score: Proposed project does not serve a MID Recovery Zone.



Category	Considerations	Scoring Criteria	
	Does the proposed project	Top Score: The proposed project demonstrates obvious benefits to Baldwin County's critical infrastructure.	
Services Benefitted	benefit critical actions such as hospitals, nursing homes, emergency shelters, etc.?	Mid Score: The proposed project demonstrates an indirect benefit to Baldwin County's critical infrastructure.	
		Low Score: The proposed project does not demonstrate a benefit to Baldwin County's critical infrastructure.	



Category	Considerations	Scoring Criteria
Project Status		Top Score: Proposed project is shovel-ready.
	Is the proposed project ready to move forward with construction upon	Mid Score: Proposed project is still in the design-phase.
	approval?	Low Score: Proposed project is still conceptual.



Category	Considerations	Scoring Criteria
Project Timeline		Top Score: Applicant outlines a realistic timeline for the proposed project, which is informed by prior experience.
	Is the proposed project timeline realistic in consideration for the grant timeline?	Mid Score: Applicant outlines an ambitious timeline for the proposed project, without providing adequate justification that such a timeline can be maintained.
		Low Score: Applicant outlines a timeline that is lacking in sufficient detail to determine project viability.



Category	Considerations	Scoring Criteria
Capacity & Experience	Does the applicant have the capacity and experience to manage the project? Does the applicant have adequate financial management methods for administering the grant?	Top Score: Applicant has demonstrated ample capacity and experience to implement and manage the proposed project, and has provided examples of strong financial management practices. Mid Score: Applicant demonstrated some experience and capacity in managing work similar to the proposed project. Low Score: Applicant has not demonstrated capacity for
		managing proposed project.



Category	Considerations	Scoring Criteria
	Will the proposed project be implemented with	Top Score: Proposed project will engage with multiple stakeholders to form partnerships that expand the service area benefitted.
Partnerships Do these partnerships increase the area benefitted by the project?	Mid Score: Proposed project will engage with stakeholders to form partnerships, but application does not demonstrate how partnerships will expand the benefitted service area(s).	
	benefitted by the project?	Low Score: Proposed project does not include partnerships.

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Category	Considerations	Scoring Criteria		
	Does the project include best-practices and innovative approaches?	Top Score: Proposed project is informed by industry best practices, and demonstrates an innovative approach to infrastructure repair.		
Innovation & Best Practices		Mid Score: Proposed project mentions industry best practices, but application does not demonstrate how the project is informed by them.		
		Low Score: Proposed project is not informed by industry best practices.


