Randox Multistat Evidence Analyzer

- 29 drugs of abuse
- Quantify the amount of a drug in a decedent
- Still utilize ADFS to confirm the amount of a drug and to search for new and novel drugs
- Better product by yielding faster results and quicker decision points.
- Release decedents faster, Fewer transports out of county
- Reduced cost per test. \$400 vs \$40

SMORT is ready to assist in the location, removal, preservation, identification, and final disposition of human remains following a mass fatality incident.






TOXICOLOGY IN TRANSPORTATION FATALITY CASES




Seat belt Usage in Automobile Fatalities

Method of Suicide 2024






BCCO Suicide and Overdose Cases
















AGES of Decedents


